<u>Group Riding reminders/tips</u> – Here is something that is odd. Did you know that by TXDOT inspection criteria for motorcycles, turn signals are NOT an item that can be inspected on ANY motorcycle? Even if you have them, they are off limits to those inspecting your bike as there are also no criteria (color, size, brightness, etc...). There is no "special" notice or errata sheet or "secret" document from TXDOT that gives inspection stations authority to perform any type of inspection on turn signals, even if you have a

bulb burned out – period. Don't believe me, look it up. <a href="https://www.dps.texas.gov/rsd/vi/inspection/inspectionCriteria.aspx">https://www.dps.texas.gov/rsd/vi/inspection/inspectionCriteria.aspx</a> also check out <a href="https://www.dps.texas.gov/msb/msbfaqs.htm">https://www.dps.texas.gov/msb/msbfaqs.htm</a> specifically question #16. Bottom line is that you cannot fail a motorcycle inspection due to having no or only partially working turn signals.

However, the smart move is that if you have them, make sure that they are in working order and USE them. Where I am going with this is that you may encounter a motorcycle that has absolutely NO turn signals on them and yet be completely street legal. This could cause issues when riding in a group. Special care must be taken to ensure a dialog is established between riders and a review of hand and arm signals is paramount. As we get closer to the Lone Star Rally, there are a lot of modified and refurbished motorcycles that generally go to this event. You may find yourself coming up on a bike with no turn signals so keep your situational awareness up. Stay alert and stay safe.
