We share the road with our unlucky misguided brothers and sisters who are doomed to ride with 4 (or more) wheels. They will make goofy moves to suddenly pass, pull out, or change lanes in front of someone (because they are impatient or frustrated) and now we have a vehicle in the middle of our formation. On top of that, we at times end up leaving folks cut off at a red light because we take too long to get through an intersection mainly because we are too strung out. On the highways with little to no traffic, by all means stretch it out a tad and relax, but there are times one needs to close it up a bit to keep the group intact. This is a general observation brought out to me by members left stranded at intersections and by comments coming from my Road Captains. Safety is key and will never be compromised but a little road situational awareness goes a long way.
