Odds and Ends

Caliente Chapter Overnight Trek to Big Bend country Friday, 10/7/2022: Twenty-Four riders on 8 bikes & 8 trikes gathered in the predawn light in the parking lot of the McDonalds in Castroville. Tony (LRC) did the pre-ride "safety briefing", as soon as we finished our McMuffins and visited the little boys & girls rooms. At 08:00, we set out on our trek to Big Bend country; stopping for breaks in Uvalde, Del Rio (lunch at Rudy's BBQ), Pecos River Overlook (bridge & pictures), Comstock (Judge Roy Bean, his Jersey Lilly & pictures) and Sanderson. We arrived in Alpine at 16:45, having traveled 331 miles. Sleeping arrangements for our group was portioned out into 5 separate area motels. Saturday, 10/8: Our chapter riders split up into two groups. One into Big Bend with Tony (LRC). One a loop along the Rio Grande with David A. (LRC). The weather was partly cloudy to perfect all day. The Big Bend route took 16 riders South into Terlingua, where we entered the national park through its Western entrance. We stopped at Santa Elena Canyon (photo op), Chisos Basin restaurant (lunch, fantastic scenery), Panther Junction (gas) and Boquillas Canyon (photo op). We continued out of the Park by heading North to Marathon and then West back to alpine. 324 miles; 2.1 gas stops. The River Road route also headed South through Terlingua stopping in the 'ghost town' for lunch at Iron Rustic (BBQ lunch & souvenir shopping), Lajitas (start following the Rio Grande), Presidio (end following the river, twist, turns, fantastic scenery), then turned North back through Marfa to Alpine. 238 miles; 2 gas stops.

Sunday, 10/9: Our weather pattern showed scattered showers were possible. Temperatures 52° -> 75°. Eleven riders from the group that had traveled through the Park on Saturday now traveled the River Route in the reverse direction of the group that had gone there before. 238 miles; 1 gas stop. No weather issues.

The remaining Caliente HOG Chapter riders headed North to Fort Davis for a tour of the Old Fort and museum/hospital, hike in the hills and a lunch of the "Best Hot Dogs in Ft. Davis". Their ride home did have some weather and motorcycle issues. ~90 miles. Another couple of bikes also went to Ft. Davis, but continued North into the Davis Mountains and rode their bike up alongside the observatory domes (fantastic vista, twists, turns & scenery). Heavy rain gear was used by this group on their homeward leg as they returned to their motel in Alpine drenched and chilled to the bone . 125 miles Monday, 10/10/2022: Columbus Day. 9 riders headed back to Castroville leaving Alpine at 08:30. Towne (LRC), followed a reverse course route. Stopping in Sanderson, slowing down to a walking pace as they passed Matthew Deyo's roadside Memorial marker to 'pay their respects' (across from Seminole Canyon State Park entrance), Del Rio (Rudy's for lunch & gas), Uvalde and Castroville. 330 miles.

The remaining 15 original riders and an additional 3 left Alpine about Noon, while trailering one HOG Chapter bike and another. They followed the same return route back into San Antonio, but stopped at Marcelino's (Mexican restaurant) in Del Rio for dinner. They all returned at sunset. 330 miles. October 15, 2022 - The temperature was near perfect at 78 degrees for the 10:00 KSU ride to the Hillside Hotel and Bistro. Nine riders on six trikes and one bike navigated the ninety two miles round trip

safely and wihout any problems. After the food and drink orders were placed, the conversation started about the Big Bend trip, childhood memories and general motorcycle topics. BT used a little different approach to getting to Casterville giving us some twists and turned that made this ride interesting putting us right at our destination spot on. After a much enjoyed meal and the tabs being paid we mounted our Harleys for the return trip to the Dealership. Not being safe to cross highway 90 as a group, Danny Garcia redirected our formation through some of the back streets and to a intersection with a traffic light where we all made it on the road safety. The extra time was worth it since we passed some very charming homes and got to observe some of Casterville not seen before. With the temperature still a pleasent 88 degrees at 1:03 pm we arrived back at Caliente safe and sound the way we like it. Damn good ride BT!
